Gov. M. Jodi Rell claims to support clean contracting legislation, but she vetoed it once last June, and she's threatening to do it again. Why? Because she refuses to support standards for deciding when billions of dollars in taxpayer money should be used for private profit. These privatization or outsourcing standards are the key component in any clean contracting legislation.

By her stance, Gov. Rell is protecting the real special interests -- the big money contractors who earn huge profits at the public expense. Continuing contracting failures have cost Connecticut's taxpayers while putting billions of dollars in the pockets of insider special interests.

We urge Governor Rell to support a clean contracting bill with real standards. Otherwise it's more government for sale.
