Prison employees union donates defibrillator

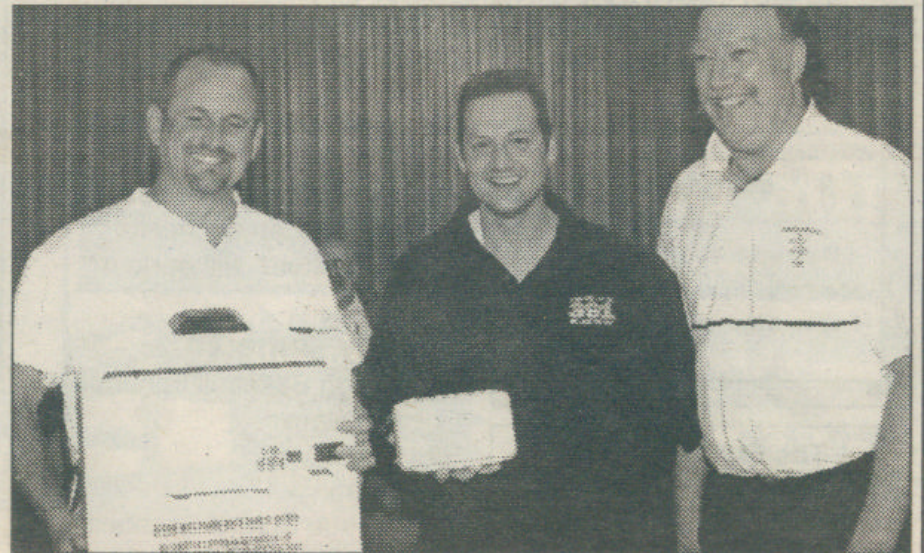
ENFIELD- Connecticut State Prison Employees Union Local 391 presented a new defibrillator to the town at Monday night's Town Council meeting. It will replace the one that was stolen out of Town Hall earlier this year.

"We got together and thought it would be a good gesture," said Todd Sokolowski, Union Treasurer and a Corrections Officer at Northern.

The new unit will also have an alarmed box aimed as a deterrent to prevent a future larceny. In total, it was more than a \$2,000 package courtesy of the union.

"Our thanks to the Corrections union to do this," said Mayor Patrick Tallarita.
